## Oil Well Road Makeover

Oil Well Road is currently undergoing an exciting transformation through two distinct projects designed to enhance safety, improve the area's appearance, and elevate the overall quality of life for residents. The first of these projects is dedicated to installing modern street lighting, aiming to brighten up the area for both pedestrians and drivers. Simultaneously, the second project focuses on beautifying the surroundings near the Arthrex Commerce Park through landscaping efforts. These initiatives are progressing on individual schedules.


A total of 24 new lights will be installed along Oil Well Road, with 14 placed to the west of Ave Maria Boulevard and the remaining 10 to the east. The new lighting is expected to decrease nighttime crashes and improve navigation, significantly enhancing safety for everyone. The lights will be mounted on sturdy 35-foot-tall aluminum poles, each featuring 8-foot arms with LED fixtures to provide bright and energy-efficient illumination.

The project, initially slated for completion by November this year, is ahead of schedule. Ted Tryka, the district engineer who manages the contract, stated, "The project is ahead of schedule with a projected completion date before the end of summer."

Two new destination signs were also installed as part of the lighting project to improve the visibility of Ave Maria's entrance.

In addition to the new lighting and signage, a robust landscaping project is planned to create a unified and aesthetically pleasing environment along Oil Well Road. The Town of Ave Maria Development standards mandate a 30-foot wide buffer along the road






adjacent to Arthrex Commerce Park. This buffer will feature clusters of existing palm trees and a continuous hedgerow of shrubs.

The new landscape plan aims to enhance the existing palm tree arrangement by incorporating Buttonwoods and Bottlebrushes for a more diverse mid-sized tree composition. Bismarck Palms will serve as focal points, complemented by a uniform hedge line for a cohesive look. The proposal also introduces curved shrub beds featuring Firebush, Variegated Schefflera, Jasmine, and Muhly Grass to enrich the garden's texture and col-

Steve Sammons, senior landscape architect of town developer Barron Collier Com-



panies' Peninsula Engineering, said, "Those plants were chosen for hardiness, ability to fill in together to create a healthy buffer and allow for a variety of textures and colors that will be repeated along the length of the buffer for consistency."

These landscape enhancements are scheduled for installation on the north side of the canal berm on both sides of Ave Maria Boulevard, from Arthrex Commerce Drive to the sod farm entry drive.

'The project's duration is expected to take 16 weeks once the contractor is given the notice to proceed, so that would put the project being completed by the end of November at the latest," Sammons said.





## Expanding Mosquito Control in Collier County

Mosquito control is crucial for life in Florida, and the Collier County Mosquito Control District has been dedicated to this since 1950. Back then, Collier County's population was just 6,488. Today, the county, including Ave Maria, is home to over 410,000 residents.

As the county continues to grow, so does the district. In mid-May this year, Governor Ron DeSantis signed Florida House Bill 509 into law, which will take effect on Tuesday, Oct. 1.

This law will expand the district's coverage area from 401 square miles to 730 square miles, marking the first expansion since 2004. The new coverage area will include Ave Maria, Port of the Islands, and regions north and east of

Golden Gate Estates. Previously, Ave Maria received mosquito control services through an inter-local agreement.

The scope of mosquito control in Collier County has expanded significantly along with the county itself. At its founding, the district provided mosquito control for just six square miles of downtown Naples, which at the time had a population of 1,458; today, it is approximately 20,000.

Collier County covers 2,305 square miles, nearly twice Rhode Island's size, spanning 1,214 square miles. 🏒

"The exponential growth in Golden Gate Estates, specifically in Ave Maria, warrants an immediate plan to support the families by providing a comprehensive public school in the community. This shows vision, strategic planning and fiscal responsibility, as it reduces transportation costs and also relieves overcrowding in Estates Elementary School," Carter shared.

The educational landscape around Ave Maria is rich and diverse, characterized by exceptional public institutions like Corkscrew Middle School and Palmetto Ridge High School, both renowned for their academic rigor and nurturing environments.

Moreover, the private sector presents a plethora of valuable educational options, meeting a wide variety of needs and preferences. The Palm Preschool, located in Ave Maria's Town Center, offers a welcoming environment focused on early education. For students from kindergarten through 12th grade, the Rhodora J. Donahue Academy provides a comprehensive education that emphasizes holistic development. Meanwhile, the Fellowship Church & Academy combines faith-based education with academic excellence, catering to those who value spiritual growth alongside intellectual development. Notably, Ave Maria University (AMU) emerges as a standout institution, distinguished by its rigorous academic programs and commitment to a school," said Lucarelli.


Ave Maria has grown significantly over the years as families started to move into the area. This increase in population highlighted the need for an elementary school to cater to the community's educational requirements.

"For several years, we have heard requests from residents for Collier County Public Schools to build a school in Ave Maria," said board member Stephanie Lucarelli, who has been involved in conversations about the school for all those years. "I'm so excited to finally be able to bring this new school to the community."


Jerry Rutherford, CCPS board member, having attended the recent Bear Creek Elementary groundbreaking, shared great enthusiasm about the future opportunities

for students at this institution and the upcoming addition of Elementary School Q to follow.

Originally planned for 500 students, the school district already grew the school in the past year when it realized the need for more

Anticipating further growth, the school district has strategically planned a two-story elementary school that allows for future expansion. This adaptable design could either incorporate a middle school or provide more space for elementary students. Elementary School Q marks a departure from the traditional prototype used in the district's other thirty-some grade schools, introducing a new design set to be unveiled this fall.

"The district's current prototype for elementary schools does not offer this growth flexibility," said Marc Rouleau, CCPS chief facilities officer. "With more than 4,300 family home closings in the Ave Maria community as of January 2024 and a projection of more than 4,700 new construction family homes in Ave Maria, the district believes this warrants an elementary school with the capacity to support 900 students."

Elementary School Q will have a new name decided based on input from the community. Although the district has not yet drawn boundaries for the school, it will likely comprise Ave Maria plus offer availability for out-of-zone school choice students, those whose parents apply for enrollment because of their work situation or other reasons.

Although it will not follow the standard design prototype, the first-of-its-kind district elementary school will conform to the curriculum and facility blueprints across the board. It will be administered to students of all special needs and talents. The district's trademark-covered physical education pavilion will counteract the conditions of the Florida sun. The school will also address other Florida weather-related needs, such as a storm shelter with reinforced walls, generator backup and other protective measures.

Once the school's name is set, a mascot and other details will be decided, and the community will have input on that, too. A new dedicated website will allow parents, students, homeowners and other interested parties to learn the latest news about the school and interact with feedback.

"We want the community to be a part of this process," CCPS chief communications officer Chad Oliver said.

"I am very interested to hear what the Ave Maria community wants to see in this new school, and I encourage them to reach out to me at stephanie.lucarelli@collierschools com with their ideas," said Lucarelli.

CCPS paused building elementary schools in 2008, but next school year (2025-2026), it will open Bear Creek Elementary at Immokalee Road and Moulder Drive in Golden Gate Estates, followed by the Ave Maria school the following year. Officials say the final decision to build the Ave Maria school was made during the 2023-2024 school year. 2

## Fred Thomas: Leaving a Lasting Legacy

Since 1986, native New Yorker Fred Thomas has been one of the most influential forces pushing to serve the underprivileged community in Immokalee, Fla.

Fred passed on Wednesday, May 22, at the age of 84. However, his legacy as the Unofficial Mayor of Immokalee lives on through the lasting effects of his work, which aimed to improve the quality and accessibility of public housing in Collier County.

In 1967, Fred graduated from Norfolk State University with a bachelor's degree in psychology. This marked the beginning of Fred's work in the field of Public Housing, where he started the journey as an intern.

Originally from Harlem, NY, Fred spent a portion of his early career relocating to different cities nationwide to improve each area's public housing sector. After assuming his role as the Executive Director for the Collier County Housing Authority (CCHA) in 1986, Fred found himself enamored with the complex landscape of Immokalee and decided to dedicate the rest of his career to bettering the community.

"There was something about it that just held him here. He thought he could make a difference," said Cherryle Thomas, Fred's wife.

Danny Gonzalez, owner of Lozano's Mexican Restaurant and President of the Immokalee Chamber of Commerce, believes that Fred's fierce dedication and relentless drive to serve Immokalee helped him genuinely connect with the community.

"He wasn't even from here, but he treasured Immokalee like it was his hometown," Gonzalez said. "He blended in with the people here. It didn't matter if you were Haitian, Mexican, Guatemalan, or anything else in this town. He helped ev-

During the first two years of his work at the CCHA, Fred devoted his summers to becoming proficient in Spanish by taking college courses. Cherryle, Fred's wife and former Director of the Immokalee Chamber of Commerce, recalls how Fred immersed himself in the language to communicate with Immokalee's primarily Hispanic demographic effec-

"He wanted to learn properly," Cherryle said. "Until the day my husband left, he would speak Spanish with anybody. He even did his applications, contracts, everything in the language."

Those who have seen Fred in action often note his commanding presence. Equipped with the makings of a natural-born leader, Fred knew how to wran-


gle any rowdy commeeting just by using two words.

"If he wanted everybody's attention, he used these words: 'Excuse me, excuse me, excuse me," Cherryle said.

Though his famous catchphrase helped garner the attention of an entire room, Fred's innovative ideas and undeniable results kept it.



going to be there."

One of the most projects notable cemented Fred's legacy as a voice for the underserved was his work to improve the Farm Workers Village housing development in Immokalee. The development offers reduced-rent housing to farm workers, most of whom are migrants.

While working with the CCHA

and attending meetings for any of the 56 boards that he was on, Fred also made sure to foster mentor-type relationships with the community's emerging youth.

Vice President of First Bank and Di-

Chamber of Commerce Bernardo Barnhart fondly regarded Fred as his mentor. Barnhart believed that Fred's eagerness to pass on his knowledge and career advice would effectively empower the rising generation of community leaders.

"He really embraced the youth," Barnhart said. "He took it upon himself to let you know that your word

means something, that you stand for thought was best for Immokalee," Gable said. something."

A strong advocate for education, Fred often preached the value of academics to the neighborhood youth. He even tutored a group of high schoolers in preparation for their SAT exam and assisted in setting up a scholarship for students in public housing.

Though Fred was often encouraged to run for Immokalee's County Commissioner, he believed that he could achieve more for the residents of Immokalee if he was not in public office.

"He wasn't beholden to any constituency other than he was going to do what he

Although the acclaim that comes with a seat in public office can be alluring, Fred stood by what he felt would be most beneficial for the community, as a role in politics could have limited the scope and impact of his work.


Fred's focus on solving issues plaguing the community of Immokalee created a profound impact on thousands of lives. Through it all, he carried with him the same values as he once shared in a 1997 article highlighting his advocacy:

"It's important for me to do the right thing, not the popular thing," Fred said. "You've got to do what's necessary and right."

"He saw the future that Naples had," said Marinelli, who has been with the company since 2006.

The corporate legacy award was announced on April 15, with a May 15 event at Miromar Lakes Beach & Golf Club in Lee County made it official with a celebratory event "I believe much of our success comes
